- The United Nations have 17 Sustainable Development Goals from which you can choose 1 to research.








































What inspired me to do 'Life Below the Water'

- He loves football and wants to look after animals when he is older.








































How do you enter the competition?

Present your views about <u>one</u> of the UN 17 Sustainable Development Goals and how you think it might be <u>addressed</u> and <u>resolved</u>.

In order to do this successfully you should include the following:

- 1. Basic information outlining the issue.
- 2. Who and/or what is impacted by the issue?
- 3. Where in the world is the issue most prevalent / in need of resolving and why?
- 4. What barriers stand in the way of resolving the issue?
- 5. How you would attempt to resolve the issue.



Where can you find inspiration?

- One of the best places to look for inspiration is Prince William's 'Earthshot' Prize!
- The Earthshot Prize is the most prestigious global environment prize in history!
- Five individual **one million-pound** prizes will be awarded each year for the next ten years, providing at least 50 solutions to the world's greatest environmental problems by 2030.
- The Prize aims to highlight the ability of human imagination & invention to bring about change through collective action.
- Taking inspiration from President John F. Kennedy's 'Moonshot' which united millions of people to put man on the moon in the 1960s, the Earthshot Prize is centred around five 'Earthshots'
 - 1. Protect and restore nature

2. Clean our air

3. Revive our oceans

4. Build a waste free world

5. Fix our climate

What are the prizes?


Part 2:
